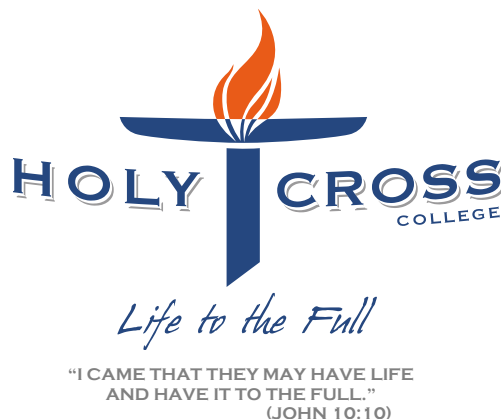


COVID-19 UPDATE

30 April 2021



Dear Parents/Guardians

Yesterday evening, Premier Mark McGowan announced that COVID-19 restrictions in the Perth metropolitan area and Peel region will be eased from 12.01am Saturday 1 May. Modified restrictions will remain in place until 12.01am on Saturday 8 May 2021.

The easing of restrictions is very positive news for our school and will mean that many of our planned activities will be able to resume with minimal disruption. Below is an outline of the arrangements and restrictions as they apply to our school.

Mask Wearing

1. All staff members and students in Years 7 to 12 will still be required to wear a mask **whilst indoors** when at school. Teachers are however no longer required to wear a mask while teaching.
2. The requirement to wear masks outdoors will be relaxed unless physical distancing is not possible. Students will not be required to wear masks outdoors.
3. Students in Kindergarten to Year 6 are still not required to wear a mask.

Common sense should apply regarding the colour and markings on masks. Masks should not contain inappropriate markings or designs.

Parents, Caregivers and Visitors on School Premises

Parents, caregivers and visitors to school, must wear a mask and adhere to COVID-safe guidelines while they are **indoors** at the College.

If parents, caregivers and visitors are outdoors on a school site, masks must be worn if physical distancing is not possible.

Indoor venues and activities

Indoor venues with fixed seating will be able to operate at 100% capacity. Masks are mandatory for indoor public venues with exemption for medical reasons and for primary school aged children or younger.

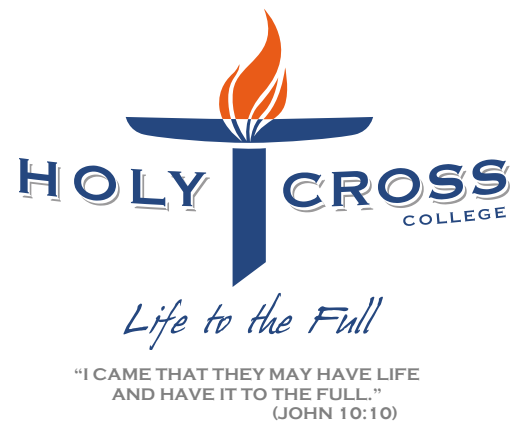
Churches may reopen to 100% capacity.

Outdoor venues and activities

Outdoor sport can resume with spectators. If outdoors, spectators are required to wear masks where physical distancing is not possible.
