APPLICATION FORM

From the very beginning Holy Cross College embraced the Aboriginal heritage of the land upon which the school is built. The College is situated in the local area of Coolamon, in the country of the Whadjuk Noongar people, the original custodians of the land. The Coolamon, or 'Yarndi' in the Noongar language, is an Aboriginal word used to describe a vessel traditionally used by women to carry water, fruit and nuts, and to cradle babies. In recognition of this rich heritage the Holy Cross College logo features the Yarndi in the cross-bar of the Cross, the central symbol of Christianity.

To further the College's commitment to our Aboriginal heritage the College Board has made provision for the Yarndi Bursary to support the aspirations of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students who seek a Catholic education where each student is challenged to achieve their personal best. The Bursary aims to recognise academic excellence, sound citizenship, strong leadership and a commitment to schooling. With a Catholic education at Holy Cross College, the College Board hopes to provide Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students with a springboard into a rewarding and successful career along with a solid foundation for making positive life choices.

Applications are invited from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students who have a passion for learning and life, and who aspire to make a difference within their local community, as well as the wider Australian community.

Yarndi Bursary Information

Introduction

Each year, the College Board sponsors the Yarndi Bursary, which covers all fees as per our published fee schedule available on our College website, for the duration of a child's schooling at Holy Cross College from Year 7 to Year 12. As this is a significant financial commitment, the College Board has stipulated a number of conditions to which recipients must adhere in order to maintain the bursary, details of which are listed below.

Eligibility Criteria

- Applicants must be of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent.
- Consideration will be given to the financial status of the applicant and their family.
- The student must have a commitment to learning.
- The student is to have a strong desire for a Catholic education.
- The family and student must support the Catholic ethos and traditions of the College and adhere to all policies and procedures.
- The applicant must be willing to be involved in the College's co-curricular activities.
- The student is to be entering Year 7 in 2024.

Bursary details and value

The value of the Bursary covers all fees as per our published fee schedule available on our College website, for the duration of a child's schooling at Holy Cross College from Year 7 to Year 12.

Parents/Guardians are responsible for the purchase of uniforms and any additional booklist items where applicable.

Review process

For each recipient of a Yarndi Bursary, the College Principal, or representative, will undertake an annual review according to the

following criteria and make a determination in regard to the continuation of the Bursary.

1. Attendance rate of no less than 90%;
2. Compliance with the College Enrolment Agreement; and
3. A measure of *Good Standing* that includes a commitment to learning, positive behaviour, acceptable participation in the extra-curricular programme and faith life of the College, and a work ethic that indicates an attitude of achieving one's personal best.

Parents will receive clear notification if the Bursary is in jeopardy of being forfeited.

Student Support

Along with general support provided through the College pastoral care structures that include the House Tutor, Subject Teachers, House Coordinators, Nurse, Social Worker, and College Psychologist, the College employs an Aboriginal Teaching Assistant (ATA). The role of the ATA is to provide specific cultural and language support; learning assistance; liaison between parents, school and the wider Aboriginal community; and the promotion of Aboriginal culture across the school community.


Selection Process

Applications will be considered by a panel consisting of:

- Holy Cross College Principal (or delegate)
- Aboriginal Teaching Assistant
- Principal's Nominee

Applicants will be required to participate in an interview with the panel.

The final decision will be made by the College Principal.

1. Applicants are to be students qualified to enter the College at Year 7;
2. Applicants must be supportive of the Catholic ethos of the College;
3. Applicants are to be demonstrably committed to schooling.
4. Successful application does not include younger siblings in later years. It is to be noted that younger siblings enrolled at the College receive normal family discounts.
5. The Bursary covers the value of all fees as per our published fee schedule available on the College website, for duration of enrolment subject to a satisfactory annual review; and
6. Failure of the successful applicant or his/her parents to adhere to the conditions of enrolment may result in the bursary being withdrawn.
