SCIENCE LABORATORY TECHNICIAN

DUTIES

TEACHER ASSISTANCE

- Fulfills the daily requirements of all Science classes.
- Provides assistance for teaching staff during lessons as required and where possible.
- Prepares and maintains adequate supplies of re-agents and other items for class use.
- Ensures that laboratories are ready for daily use and secured at night.
- Establishes an efficient experiment booking and collection (pack-up) system.
- Makes scientific apparatus as needed (where possible).

SAFETY

- Maintains a safe and clean working environment.
- Laboratories are cleared of all equipment and chemicals at the end of practical sessions (prior to the next break).
- Equipment is cleaned and put away within 24 hours of use.
- Helps staff and students take proper care of the College laboratories and

equipment.

- Maintains Material Safety Data Sheets for all current chemicals.
- Checks on all safety and first aid equipment on a regular basis. This is done in consultation with the First Aid Officer and the Maintenance Department.

MAINTENANCE

- Orders equipment and supplies in consultation with the Learning Area Leader for Science
- Prepares and maintains chemical and equipment registers.
- Conducts an annual stock take of all equipment and chemical supplies. This is then to be reconciled with the asset register.
- Maintains the appropriate records of all purchases in consultation with the Learning Area Coordinator so as to monitor and reconcile the monthly account statements.
- Works with the Learning Area Coordinator to prepare the Departmental Budget.
- Assists Learning Area Coordinator to investigate the cost and availability of laboratory apparatus.

OTHER DUTIES

- Supervises and allocates daily tasks of the Laboratory Assistant.
- Takes part in in-services and other courses related the Laboratory Technician's work, when College finances permit and with the Principal's approval.
- Maintains the health of laboratory animals.
- Implements all College and laboratory policies.
- Attends Science staff meetings.
- Carries out other duties as required by the Learning Area Coordinator or by the Principal.
