

Yarndi Bursary

Kindergarten 2026

Each year, the College Advisory Council sponsors the Yarndi Bursary, which covers all fees as per our published fee schedule available on the College website, for the duration of a child's schooling at Holy Cross College from Kindergarten to Year 6.

From the very beginning, Holy Cross College embraced the First Nations heritage of the land upon which the school is built. The College is situated in the local area of Coolamon, in the country of the Whadjuk Noongar people, the original custodians of the land. The Coolamon, or 'Yarndi' in the Noongar language, is a First Nations word used to describe a vessel traditionally used by women to carry water, fruit and nuts, and to cradle babies. In recognition of this rich heritage the Holy Cross College logo features the Yarndi in the cross-bar of the Cross, the central symbol of Christianity.

To further the College's commitment to our First Nations heritage, the College Advisory Council has made provision for the Yarndi Bursary to support the aspirations of First Nations and Torres Strait Islander students who seek a Catholic education where each student is challenged to achieve their personal best. The Bursary aims to recognise academic excellence, sound citizenship, strong leadership and a commitment to schooling. With a Catholic education at Holy Cross College, the College Advisory Council hopes to provide First Nations and Torres Strait Islander students with a springboard into a rewarding and successful career along with a solid foundation for making positive life choices.

Applications are invited from First Nations and Torres Strait Islander families who have a passion for learning and life, and who are looking forward to being a part of the Holy Cross Community.

As this is a significant financial commitment, the College Advisory Council has stipulated a number of conditions to which recipients must adhere in order to maintain the Bursary, details of which are listed on the following page.

Eligibility criteria

- Applicants must be of First Nations or Torres Strait Islander descent.
- Consideration will be given to the financial status of the applicant and their family.
- Families must have a commitment to learning.
- Families are to have a strong desire for a Catholic education.
- Parents and students must support the Catholic ethos and traditions of the College and adhere to all policies and procedures.
- The applicant must be willing to be involved in the College's co-curricular activities.
- The student is to be entering Kindergarten in 2026.

Bursary details and value

The value of the Bursary covers all fees as per our published fee schedule available on the College website, for the duration of a child's schooling at Holy Cross College from Kindergarten to Year 6.

Parents/Guardians are responsible for all other fees including uniforms.

Review process

For each recipient of a Yarndi Bursary, the College Principal, or representative, will undertake an annual review according to the following criteria and make a determination in regard to the continuation of the Bursary.

- 1. Attendance rate of no less than 90%:
- 2. Compliance with the College Enrolment Agreement; and
- A measure of Good Standing that includes a commitment to learning, positive behaviour, acceptable participation in the extra-curricular program and faith life of the College, and a work ethic that indicates an attitude of achieving one's personal best.

Parents will receive clear notification if the Bursary is in jeopardy of being forfeited.

Student support

Along with general support provided through the College pastoral care structures that include the Class Teachers, House Representatives, Nurse, Social Worker and College Psychologist, the College employs a First Nations Teaching Assistant. The role of the First Nations Teaching Assistant is to provide specific cultural and language support, learning assistance, and maintain contact with parents, school and the wider First Nations community, and the promotion of First Nations culture across the school community.

Selection Process

Applications will be considered by a panel consisting of:

- Holy Cross College Principal (or delegate)
- First Nations Teaching Assistant
- Principal's Nominee

Families may be required to participate in an interview with the Principal.

The final decision will be made by the College Principal.
