Position Description

This position as a Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS) teacher (Years 7–12) is due to Holy Cross College's continued growth in enrolment numbers and its commitment to providing a values-based education grounded in the Catholic tradition. The HASS teacher plays a vital role in developing students' understanding of human behaviour, social structures, history, geography, and civic responsibility through engaging and thought-provoking learning experiences.

As a member of the Humanities and Social Sciences Learning Area, the HASS teacher must have strong curriculum knowledge and a passion for exploring the complexities of societies past and present. The role requires a commitment to collaborative teaching practice, a willingness to contribute to the ongoing development of the learning area, and dedication to continuous professional growth. Candidates with experience teaching ATAR and/or General courses are encouraged to apply.

Reporting to the Learning Area Leader Humanities and Social Sciences, the HASS teacher is expected to engage all learners in alignment with the College's Vision for Learning. This includes designing and delivering curriculum with clarity and creativity, using student-centred, inquiry-based approaches that encourage critical thinking, ethical reflection, and active citizenship.

- Use a range of assessment strategies to monitor and evaluate student progress, and provide timely, constructive feedback.
- Establish high expectations for learning, behaviour, and personal responsibility, promoting a positive and respectful environment in the classroom in line with the College's Behaviour Support Guidelines.
- Maintain accurate records, complete reporting requirements, and communicate effectively with parents and caregivers.
